

Farm Families gains \$2.9 million for two years

Sustainable Farm Families has \$2.9 million in funding to continue its work over the next two years.

Minister for Agriculture Joe Helper announced the funding when he was in Hamilton in August. SFF is a nationally-recognised project, which was developed by WDHS Community Services, and is led by Community Services Director, Sue Brumby.

The project has been trialled by 700 farming families in the past three years, addressing their health and safety needs. The additional money has been granted so the project can be offered to another 1000 farmers across 50 locations throughout Victoria.

Mr Helper said the SFF program was an intuitively logical approach to farmers' wellbeing and he commended Ms Brumby and her team for their vision and hard work.
