### The Ripple Effect

# Steering Group Nominations now open closing Sunday 26 July 2015

Are you passionate about supporting farmers affected by suicide? The Ripple Effect Steering Group could be for you.

The Ripple Effect is an online intervention being designed to investigate what works to reduce self-stigma (negative the attitudes you have towards yourself) and perceived-stigma (negative attitudes you believe others have about you) among the males from farming community, aged 30-64 years, who have lost someone to suicide, attempted suicide themselves, cared for someone who has attempted suicide. experienced thoughts about their own suicide, or have been touched by suicide in some other way.

The Steering Group will comprise between 10-15 members, with at least three males from the farming community and aged 30-64 with a lived experience of suicide. The remainder will include stigma experts, academics, health professionals, industry representatives and digital designers.

Members will be appointed for a period of 18-24 months. The initial meeting will be face-to-face with further meetings held via tele/videoconference. A small sitting fee will be paid.
