Making a difference to farmers' lives

Wow - What a year!

What a year it's been! Since receiving the generous funding announcement from the Hon. Jaala Pulford, Victorian Minister for Agriculture and Regional Development, in April we have been flat out!

AgriSafeTM Clinics commenced in partnership with Lake Bolac Bush Nursing Centre, then Penshurst and then Hamilton. We delivered over 200 full health assessments with farm men and women located in Victoria, SA and QLD.

We have entered into a new information partnership with the national Health Direct service. Our farmer health fact sheets will now be available through their website to a wider audience and complement our longstanding partnership with Better Health Channel.

The Ripple Effect project has begun, with strong support from a national steering committee, with the objective of reducing the stigma of rural suicide. Sustainable Farm FamiliesTM now has a new group of 20 facilitators and health professionals, following the 'Train the Trainer' workshop in December. We are ready to roll out programs across Victoria and already have two programs booked in for VIC in 2016, and one in SA.

Research has been busy too with five peer-reviewed publications – from skin cancer in farmers to pesticide exposures. You can read them on our website.

In October we recognised our new partnership with Rural Bank by signing a Memorandum of Understanding. Our plans are in place for a collaborative approach to supporting rural and agricultural communities.
