Jan 2007 fatality: together 2 x 21 year olds

Not again!!

6 fatalities in 6 years, 20km radius Cressy 4 irrigation, 4 electricity (3 young), 3 machinery, 2 crush



Keeps on happening Nothing changes!

Electricity Safety our 1st project Widespread in rural communities Rarely any 2nd chances

Coroners Recommendation: Never store irrigation pipes under powerlines
