Weekly Rainfall Checking in with farmers

Bairnsdale Neighbourhood House hosted a community barbecue for farmers last week as part of a program designed to check-in with farmers.

The National Centre for Farmer Health, Red Cross, the National Emergency Management Agency, the Rural Financial Counselling Service and the East Gippsland Shire Council were involved in the event.

The National Centre for Farmer Health was founded in 2008 by the Victorian Government's Future Farming Strategy and the Helen and Geoff Handbury Trust in partnership with Deakin University and is designed to make a difference to farmers lives.

Program coordinator, Tracey Hatherell, said farmers are often under stress and have had a particularly hard time in East Gippsland since the Black Summer Bushfires of 2019/20.

"They've been through so much and often they don't take time for themselves, so this day is designed them

oppaortunity," Ms Hatherell said.

"People do get overwhelmed, so this is really to let them know we're here to help."

As well as enjoying a barbecue and a milk shake from Gippsland Jersey, the farmers were able to undergo a complimentary health check.

"We try to get farmers to think about their own health and safety as that's an important part of the farming business," Ms Hatherell said.

She says it's not always male farmers neglecting their health, "women do as well".

Ms Hatherell said "people are more open to having a health check at events like this".

Our most recent bull purchase is by Wulfs Excelsior, a bull in the US that won a feedlot feed conversion trial, taken over the stock of 150 bulls (12 limousins). Excelsior's stock beat every breed.

"We firmly believe in having a cow herd that can really produce, all are monitored and culled on calfs performance, we have some cow superstar bloodlines in LLoyds polled Wanda, Mandayen Abigail and Virginia represented in the herd.

"We know people tend to be loyal to their particular breed, but 25 to 50 kilo weight advantage thru hybrid vigour is not to be overlooked by the commercial grower.
